The city is safe, clean and modern, featuring an excellent public education system as well as several reputable post-secondary institutions including the world-renowned University of Alberta.

International students can experience festivals of arts, dance and theatre performances, professional hockey and football games, excellent dining and numerous shopping opportunities. With its cosmopolitan reputation, Edmonton also offers opportunities for cultural, business and recreational partnerships on an international level.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Edmonton Public Schools (EPS) has an excellent reputation for education programming. The District has offered an International Student Program (ISP) since 1995 and each year, serves over 700 students from all over the world. The program is well established and committed to the goal of educating students in a challenging and active school environment. Students attending any of the 13 high schools in the city are assured of receiving a high-quality education with the assistance of highly qualified and caring teachers, counsellors and staff.

The program features the provincial curriculum with Canadian peers as well as English as a Second Language (ESL) programming for students whose first language is not English. The ESL program is designed for students who wish to improve their English language skills in a friendly, yet challenging atmosphere. International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement programs are in place for more academically capable students.

The provincial curriculum consists of a challenging core of courses: English, social studies, mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics, fine arts, and career and technology studies. In addition, students may select from a number of options to create a unique program that meets the requirements of the educational system of the province of Alberta. Students who graduate from grade 12 in Edmonton's public school system are qualified to apply to all universities, colleges and institutes in Canada and elsewhere.

International students have the advantage of graduating from a leading Canadian school system while gaining fluency in English, a skill that has practical applications worldwide.

ACTIVITIES AND FACILITIES

EPS offers advanced facilities to assist students with their education. Academic resources include computer-assisted instruction, scientific laboratories, dance studios, television studios, libraries and technology centres.

Students have access to excellent athletics and recreational facilities. Sports such as soccer, basketball, badminton and cross-country skiing are available as well as extracurricular activities for those with interests in areas such as creative writing, photography and student leadership.

REFUND POLICY

- Once students commence study in Edmonton Public Schools no refunds will be issued.
- There will be no refunds issued for late arrivals.
- Refunds will be provided if the student
 - is denied admission to Edmonton Public Schools
 - is unable to obtain a Study Permit prior to September 30th becomes a Permanent Resident of Canada or the student's parent obtains a Work Permit or Study Permit (program dependent) valid for the duration of the student's study program
- All refund requests must be made in writing and will be provided to the original payer only.

ADMISSION

Applications to the International Student Program can be submitted by e-mail (scanned documents accepted), courier or registered post, as per the instructions found on our website or application form.

Only complete applications will be accepted, and must include copies of the applicant's:

- ISP application form, fully completed, including requested study period, living arrangements and school preferences
- passport
- transcripts for the past two school years, translated in English
- letter of recommendation from current teacher or principal, translated in English
- immunization records
- notarized custodianship declaration, if under 18 years old (this document will be provided for students who participate in the Homestay program)
- payment in full of application fee, tuition fee and health insurance fee

Applications will be reviewed for acceptability to the program upon receipt of the full application and payment of fees. Once accepted to the program, an official Letter of Acceptance from Edmonton Public Schools will be issued to the applicant, which must be used in the students' application for a Study Permit from Citizenship & Immigration Canada. Completed Study Permit applications must be sent to Canadian diplomatic missions abroad where permit processing services are available. Students are encouraged to submit their Study Permit applications to at least three to four months in advance, to ensure ample processing time.

HOMESTAY PROGRAM

Edmonton Public Schools works with The Canada Homestay Network (CHN) to support international students who require Homestay services while attending EPS. Together, Edmonton Public Schools and CHN offer warm and welcoming Homestays so students will be well-supported during their program of studies in Edmonton. To support students in Homestay, the services of CHN Relationship Managers are available to assist both students and their host families when and if needed. SUPPORT FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The International Programs team as well as school-based staff and students assist international students in coping and adapting to their new environment in the least stressful manner possible. Teachers and student advisers are available to counsel students on issues concerning finances, school and personal well-being, and transitions to post-secondary studies. Multilingual staff are available to provide interpretation and translation services.

Many District schools offer international clubs that address the unique cultural circumstances of international students. With the help of staff, students can also arrange celebrations and social gatherings with other international students in order to ease the stress of being alone in Canada.

- Performance of senior high international students on Alberta Education Diploma courses for 2016/17 – percentage of students who met or exceeded the provincial acceptable standard:

 - Social Studies 30-2: 90%
 - Chemistry 30: 98%

- Performance of junior high international students on Alberta provincial achievements tests for 2016/17 – 100% met or exceeded the acceptable standard in Math, 67% met or exceeded the acceptable standard in Science, 50% met or exceeded the acceptable standard in Social Studies, and 50% met or exceeded the acceptable standard in Language Arts.
- International students scored almost perfect school attendance rates in the 2016/17 school year.
